Recycling: Made Easy!

Charleston County's [Environmental Management Department](#) is expanding its curbside recycling pickup service, beginning with several new West Ashley neighborhoods, will begin Wednesday, February 24.

To improve recycling collection data, recycling trucks are now equipped with counters that drivers



use to track homeowner recycling participation rates. This data, along with efficiencies implemented to truck route operations, have led to opportunities to increase neighborhood coverage.



Recyclable materials are picked up every two weeks and residents along pickup routes are asked to have their recycling bins at the curb by 7 a.m. on the day of pickup. Blue bins have been delivered to the communities added to the curbside service. A list of what recyclables can be placed in the blue bins for pickup, the 2010 curbside recycling calendar and more are available at recycle.charlestoncounty.org. The City of Charleston joins Nashville, TN, Arlington, VA, and San Diego, CA as participants in ICLEI's Green Office Challenge. Due to the success of the program in Chicago, ICLEI decided to offer intensive training to four other pilot communities. The innovative program engages property managers and tenants in a friendly competition to save money and reduce energy use in their buildings, as well as reduce waste, save water, and reach other environmental goals. ICLEI cites the city's robust partnerships and deep commitment to sustainability goals as the rea-

How will you get your Energy Star rebate?

Rebates from \$50 to \$400 being offered in South Carolina. A total of \$3.9 million will be available in rebates for purchase of ENERGY STAR appliances in the state beginning March 31, 2010 and will continue until the funds run out. The program is being funded via federal stimulus money being distributed to each state. Make sure you buy after March 31 with the rebate being applied directly at the register! The rebate program extends to solar water heaters and HVAC systems. Customers participating in the program will require that installers recycle their old, inefficient appliances to ensure that they are taken off the power grid.
